Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary will offer classes during the Spring 2012 Semester at the Tampa Bay Extension Center. These courses will enable college graduates to earn credits toward the **Master of Arts** (Christian Studies) degree (48 hours) and the **Master of Divinity** degree (90 hours). The **Master of Divinity** degree (90 hours) is the basic seminary degree for pastoral ministry offering a broad and strong foundation of training for ministry. Sixty hours may be completed at the Tampa Extension through the courses and on-line studies. The M.Div. requires a minimum of 24 hours on campus (these on-campus hours can be completed in courses offered in J-terms, Wake Forest Hybrids, and short summer sessions; 12 of these required hours may be completed as supervised field ministry or mission trips). Up to 42 hours of the M.Div. may be taken online. The **MA (Christian Studies)** can be completed at the Tampa Extension. Students may earn up to 24 hours through online classes. Both degrees may be completed without moving to North Carolina.

The M.A. degree (48 hours) includes the core courses (33 hours) plus 12 hours of free electives that may be taken in any discipline to enable the student to focus on a particular ministry emphasis. A final summative evaluation (3 hours) can now be taken as online course. Students no longer need to sign a disclaimer for this degree. Both degrees are A.T.S. and SACS accredited.

Three courses are offered on Saturdays from 8:00 A.M.—5:00 P.M., and one on Mondays 6:45-9:15 P.M.

ADMISSIONS

Students who have not previously been admitted to the Seminary should contact the Office of Admissions (919-761-2280) to apply at least 30 days before courses begin. Prospective students can also fill out an online application directly from www.sebts.edu. There is a \$30.00 non-refundable application fee for admission. Late applications may be accepted during either of the first two class sessions by completing the Non-degree Application Form and paying the application fee.

REGISTRATION PAYMENT DEADLINES

Registration and payment deadlines and monthly late fees follow those for the main campus. New students may register for courses by contacting the Distance Learning Office at the Main Campus: 919.761.2269. Returning students should register themselves through CampusNet. Spring 2012 tuition fee for Southern Baptist students are \$238 per credit hour and \$477 per credit hour for non-Southern Baptist students.

COURSE DROPS

Students may drop a course without penalty and receive a full refund if they do so before the published deadline (February 13, 2012). This deadline will also be the last day that a student can withdrawal without academic penalty. After that point, a letter grade will appear on the student's transcript (WP or WF).

LIBRARY PRIVILEGES

By enrolling in courses at the Tampa Bay Extension Center, the student is granted Student Extension Library privileges from the Library on the main campus in Wake Forest, North Carolina. This entitles the student to check out up to three books for 30 days. Books may be checked out by coming to the Southeastern campus, by written request or by phone, (919.556.3101, ext 251).
